<b>Short description</b>	<p>The MSCA Doctoral Networks aim to train creative, entrepreneurial, innovative and resilient doctoral candidates, able to face current and future challenges and to convert knowledge and ideas into products and services for economic and social benefit.</p> <p>The MSCA Doctoral Networks raise the attractiveness and excellence of doctoral training in Europe. They equip researchers with the right combination of research-related and transferable competences and provide them with enhanced career perspectives in both the academic and non-academic sectors through international, interdisciplinary and inter-sectoral mobility combined with an innovation-oriented mind-set.</p> <p>There are three different modalities:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>1. Doctoral Networks (DN):</b> Doctoral Networks aim to meet the objectives mentioned above by enrolling candidates in a doctoral programme and a joint research project.</li> <li><b>2. Industrial Doctorates (DN-ID):</b> Industrial Doctorates aim to meet the objectives of DN but go further by requiring the mandatory involvement of the non-academic sector in the doctoral training so that the skills acquired better match public and private sector needs.</li> <li><b>3. Joint Doctorates (DN-JD):</b> Joint Doctorates also aim to meet the objectives of DN but go further by proposing the creation of joint doctoral programmes, leading to the delivery of joint, double or multiple doctoral degrees recognised in at least two EU Member States (MS) or Horizon Europe Associated Countries (AC).</li> </ol> <p>Project duration: 48 months. Researchers are recruited for minimum 3 and maximum 36 months. They must be enrolled in a doctoral programme and should work full-time on the project.</p>
